She has served on the Board of Trustees for Nebraska Indian Community College, was an Associate Fellow for the Center of the Great Plains Studies with the University of Nebraska, and has served on the Nebraska Indian Commission on the Status of Women. Additionally, she is a professional mediator and negotiator and has offered such services for several years.
